

I think the clanking of all my dishes made them curious, but it successfully got them out of their rooms and initiated some conversation. They began to tell me about the circumstances that led them to TLC, in which I reciprocated in sharing my personal background that has led me to become a volunteer. As soon as I began to talk with the little girl that was staying there, we clicked. She was thrilled to have someone young who was able to keep with her. Since volunteering at TLC, I have never not seen a smile on the little girl's face, which is the ultimate goal for all of this; helping people find comfort and joy in some of their most difficult phases of life."

<u>Growing our Resources – Exciting News</u> <u>about Funding</u>

Thanks to so many generous people in our community, the TLC is now actually up and running and providing the services that we have been focused on. To continue to provide these services, however, revenue growth on an ongoing basis is necessary. To that end, we are excited, and very grateful to the First Presbyterian Church of Tiffin for putting forth a funding challenge for the TLC. Put simply, First Presbyterian will match any contributions that are made to the TLC, up to a maximum of \$50,000, and that challenge will extend through the end of this year.

First Presbyterian was one of our first very generous donors providing an initial \$100,000 for startup costs, and once again they are sharing their generosity as the TLC works toward financial sustainability. Funding for the TLC translates into improving the opportunities for individuals who have experienced homelessness, and has been mentioned before, as we focus on "people" development, we

also have the potential to impact "community" development as well. These last three months of 2022 will be crucial in not only meeting the First Presbyterian challenge, but also helping to secure the future of mission of the TLC. There are some specific fund-raising activities and outreach events that will be taking place over this period.

As we continue to grow our outreach and our fundraising activities, we are hoping that the community as a whole will take this opportunity to support the TLC and help us grow toward the challenge maximum. No donation is too small; it's important to note that, although we had some large and very generous donations for which we will always be grateful, there were many smaller donations which absolutely helped get the TLC to where it is today. The work of the TLC depends so much on the support of the community, both large and small.
