Deadline for submitting an application is Jan. 18, 2019.

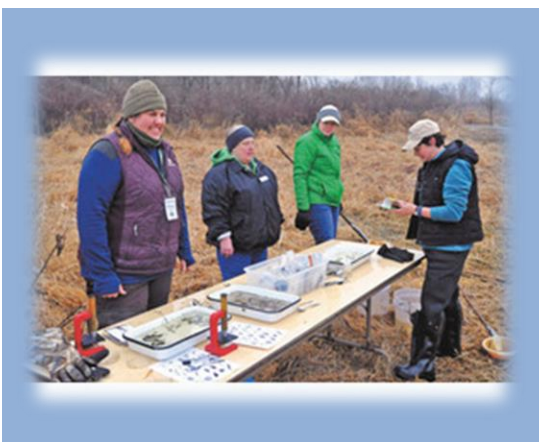
